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
YEAR 3 ROMAN WORKSHOP

UNICEF Rights of the Child

Article 34: Protection from sexual abuse The government should protect children from sexual exploitation (being taken advantage of) and sexual abuse, including by people forcing children to have sex for money, or making sexual pictures or films of them.



Safeguarding: Keeping Safe

Children need to be supervised, guided and supported. We talk with children, in school, about keeping themselves safe and what are good choices. It is important that parents and carers are also doing the same and setting a good example of 'being safe' to the children in their care. After half term, will have 'Child Safety Week'. During this time, children will learn about keeping safe, their rights and who helps protect them , as well as how they can keep themselves safe.

- Do not leave children unattended at the park
 a number of our younger pupils have reported playing at local parks without adult supervision.
- * Do not let children walk around the neighbourhood without adult supervision - Road traffic accidents increase yearly, and it is important that we do all we can to prevent these from happening. Pupils should not be left to cross roads and walk around their local area, until they are preparing for secondary education and are confident to do so.
- * Talk to children about safe choices and being safe, including online - there are a range of resources online to help support teaching children about being safe. The NSPCC have a great range of resources for both children and adults.
