This week we sent home a letter about Christmas Lunches, including details about the arrangements, the cost and what you can order.








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Safeguarding: 'County Lines'



It is likely you will have heard the term 'County Lines'. This is a form of criminal activity that exists nationally and regionally, here in Birmingham and across the West Midlands. It is a term used to describe organised criminal networks involved in exporting illegal drugs from urban areas into rural areas.

The leaders of these gangs are likely to exploit children and vulnerable adults, often without them realising it, to move (and store) drugs and money. They use coercion, intimidation, violence and weapons. Terms such as 'Going Country' and 'Out of Town' are also used.

We often see images of missing teenagers shared online. It is believed many of these are linked to exploitation and links to organised crime.

Birmingham schools are working together with West Midlands Police and partners to tackle this issue. At St. Clement's we educate children on how to stay safe, making choices and positive relationships.
