This half term our Value focus will be **Compassion**



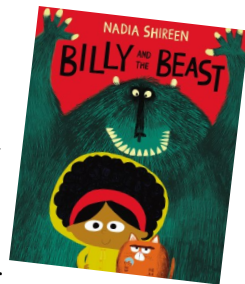
Hello,

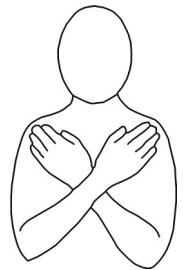

Birmingham & Solihull Women's Aid have been commissioned by West Midlands Violence Reduction Partnership and West Midlands Police & Crime Commissioner, to provide a series of 6 sessions to children in Early Years settings. 'Bright Beginnings' is a workshop programme developed by Birmingham and Solihull Women's Aid.

The programme takes inspiration from Women's Aid national programme and has developed age-appropriate workshop sessions around positive relationships, feeling safe, support networks and emotions. During the sessions we aim to create a space where children feel safe to explore complex topics, we create an environment where children feel trusted and supported. We aim to help children to understand their right to always feel safe, we encourage children to realise their feelings are important and guide them in practicing non-violent problem-solving skills. We aim to help children to understand ways to express any strong feelings in an appropriate manner and what it means to be a good friend.

EYFS parents will get further information in the Bright Beginnings Parent Pack, which gives lots of information on the sessions being held and ideas for activities at home.

We hope to end the 6 sessions with a parent workshop where the children can showcase their fabulous learning.

UNICEF Rights of the Child



Article 30: Minority culture, language and religion Children have the right to use their own language, culture and religion - even if these are not shared by most people in the country where they live.



Article 31: Rest, play, culture, arts Every child has the right to rest, relax, play and to take part in cultural and creative activities.



Article 32: Protection from harmful work Children have the right to be protected from doing work that is dangerous or bad for their education, health or development. If children work, they have the right to be safe and paid fairly.



Article 33: Protection from harmful drugs Governments must protect children from taking, making, carrying or selling harmful drugs.
