Safeguarding: What is GDPR?

The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), a European Union law, came into effect on May 25, 2018, to give individuals more control over their personal data and impose strict limitations on how organisations can use it.



The GDPR aims to give individuals greater control over their personal information. It also seeks to simplify regulations for international businesses. When considering what personal data to share, be mindful of privacy and security, only sharing what's necessary with trusted individuals or organisations and only for legitimate purposes.

What is Personal Data?

- * Personal data includes information that can identify you, either directly or indirectly.
- * Examples include name, address, phone number, email address, date of birth, photos, and even location data.
- * Sensitive data like health information, financial details, and religious beliefs also fall under this category.
