

Our Shining Stars assembly on Monday showcased some of the super progress being made in all year groups. It was lovely to see so many family members in school to celebrate their children's achievements. We really look forward to seeing more of you in school for assemblies and workshops. There will be plenty of them coming up during the Summer Term. Thank you to the parents that attended the Y6 and the Y2 SATs workshop. I think you'd agreed it is important to try to understand exactly what the expectations are for your child, especially in these end of key stage years.



Attendance has been slightly better in most year groups this term, congratulations to Year 6 who were our attendance winners for Spring term. Some year groups still have consistently lower than target attendance and this is a huge concern when we consider that studies show a clear correlation between regular attendance and higher grades and improved engagement. Attendance fosters lifelong learning habits. Beyond academics, consistent attendance instils responsibility, self-discipline, and time management skills, valuable for personal and professional growth. We are now analysing pupils achievements in termly assessments with their overall attendance since EYFS and there is a clear correlation between lower test scores and lower attendance. Miss Akers is inviting in parents where attendance is becoming a concern, please ensure you attend if you receive an invite.

Year 6 and Year 2 will have a busy time over the break, revising and practicing for their SATs which will be just a couple weeks after the break. Year 6 are also invited to the Easter revision club Mon & Tues of the first week of the break. Every little helps!

Monday 14th & Tuesday 15th for Year 6 children. This is an important chance for children to practice revision skills and prepare for their SATs.





























Easter Jesus

UNICEF Rights of the Child



Article 22: Refugee children Children who move from their home country to another country as refugees (because it was not safe for them to stay there) should get help and protection and have the same rights as children born in that country.



Article 23: Children with disabilities Every child with a disability should enjoy the best possible life in society. Governments should remove all obstacles for children with disabilities to become independent and to participate actively in the community.



Article 25: Review of a child's placement Every child who has been placed somewhere away from home - for their care, protection or health - should have their situation checked regularly to see if everything is going well and if this is still the best place for the child to be.



economic help Governments should provide money or other support to help children from poor families.
