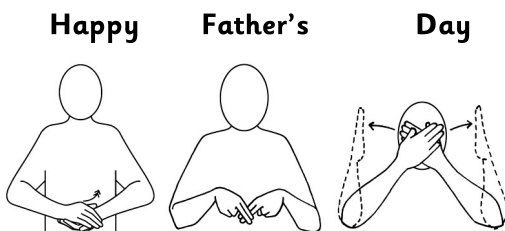
### UNICEF Rights of the Child

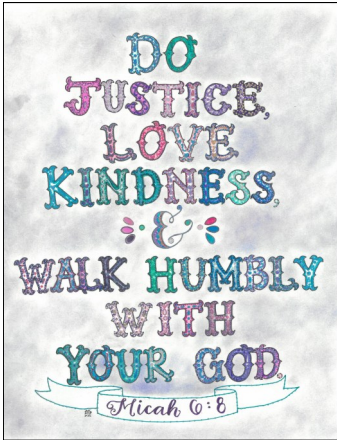

## Safeguarding



At school we work closely with other agencies so that our pupils can get the best support for their needs. One of the agencies we work with is 'Beyond the Horizon'. They offer a range of services that help better the lives of children and families.

As well as being able to support children through referrals to external agencies, we have Trauma Informed staff who can deliver a range of therapies to help children at St. Clement's.

Emotional support and being able to develop positive ways to talk about how you feel is important in keeping good mental health and coping strategies for the future. Children at the academy are taught to talk about how they feel and share their needs, wants and feelings with their trusted adults.
