Governments should actively tell children and adults about this Convention so that everyone knows about children's rights.





Since 1995, Stop Hate UK has been leading in Anti-Hate and Anti-Discrimination work

Today, they operate the UK's only free dedicated 24-hour anti-Hate Crime reporting service for all monitored strands of a person's identity or perceived identity (Disability, Race, Faith/Religion/Belief, Sexual Orientation, and Transgender identity, as well as Alternative Subculture and Gender/Misogyny).

Stop Hate UK was originally established in direct response to the murder of Stephen Lawrence.

Our Mission: To combat prejudice and Hate, to support those affected and to educate towards a Hate free society.

Safeguarding: Hate Crime

Hate crime not only harms its victims, but it also harms their families and communities. The government is committed to tackling hate crime. We want to raise awareness of what a hate crime is and help people understand that it is not right to target individuals based on their identity.



A hate crime is any criminal offence which is perceived by the victim, or anybody else, to be motivated by hostility or prejudice towards someone's:

- * Race
- * Religion and beliefs
- * Sexual orientation
- * Gender Reassignment
- * Marriage and Civil Partnership
- * Age
- * Disability
- * Maternity
- * Gender

These aspects are known as 'protected characteristics'. A hate crime can include verbal abuse, intimidation, threats, harassment, assault and damage to property. A hate incident is behaviour which isn't a crime, but which is perceived by the victim, or anybody else, to be motivated by hostility or prejudice based on the 5 protected characteristics.

You can report a hate crime online or call 101 to speak to the police.

Call 999 if you're reporting a crime that's in progress or if someone is in immediate danger.
