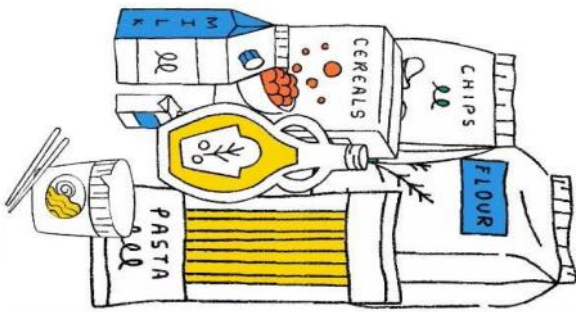
# Stop and Think: Are you driving safely?
