Tips for coping in hot weather



Look out for those who are most at risk: the elderly, young children, babies and those with underlying health conditions - help them to keep themselves cool and hydrated.



Stay cool indoors - many of us will need to stay safe at home this summer. Learn how to keep your home cool, see gov.uk.



Close curtains in rooms that face the sun to keep indoor spaces cooler. Remember, it may be cooler outdoors than indoors.



If going outdoors, use cool spaces considerably, keep your distance and follow government Covid-19 guidance to use public spaces safely.



Drink plenty of fluids and avoid excess alcohol. If you are leaving the house, take a bottle of water.



Never leave anyone or any animal in a closed, parked vehicle.



Try to keep out of the sun during the hottest part of the day - 11 in the morning to 3 in the afternoon.



Walk in the shade, apply sunscreen regularly and wear a wide-brimmed hat if you go out in the heat.



Avoid exercising during the hottest parts of the day. Try and exercise before 11am or after 3pm if you can.



If you are going into open water (rivers, lakes and the sea) to cool down, take care and follow local safety advice.

- Anyone aged 18 and over can request a listener through our free service
- Our listeners are fully trained and available seven days a week
- We are available to chat via phone, video conferencing or in person
- Clients can access up to 9 listening sessions, although more can be agreed upon in exceptional circumstances
- Each listening session may last up to 45 minutes, providing clients time to discuss their concerns in a confidential and discrete setting.

Safeguarding: Medication in school

Please ensure you complete a medical form at the school office when sending medication into school. Below is guidance school follows when administering medication.

- * Appropriate training will be given to staff to ensure the safety of pupils and that they can administer medication.
- * Medicines will not be administered unless they are in-date, labelled, in the original container and accompanied by instructions.
- * To give prescription or non-prescription medicine to a child under 16, parental consent will be asked for, unless in exceptional circumstances
- * Medication will always be available for pupils and staff.
- * Force will never be used to administer medication that is refused by the child.
