**Safeguarding:
Sexual Harassment and
Violence in Schools**

Schools must implement a whole-school approach that prevents sexual harassment and never tolerates or normalises it as "banter". Key steps include; clear reporting pathways, training staff on professional boundaries, and integrating safety into the curriculum. Schools have a legal duty to take reasonable steps to prevent it from occurring. Adhering to safeguarding guidance involves the following responsibilities:

- * Policy and Culture: Schools must never dismiss concerning behaviour—such as inappropriate touching, sexual remarks, or sharing non-consensual images (e-safety and sextortion)—as normal parts of growing up.
- * A zero-tolerance message must extend to all staff, agency workers, parents, and visitors.
- * Clear Reporting Mechanisms: Establish transparent, child-friendly systems that allow students to report abuse safely, knowing it will be taken seriously.
- * Appoint a designated single point of contact or non-teaching support for victims to ensure their needs remain the priority (Miss Akers).
- * Curriculum and Prevention: A regularly updated behaviour policy and RSE/PSHE curriculum to educate pupils on consent, what constitutes sexual harassment, and the sanctions for such actions.
- * Preventative Duty: Schools are legally obligated under the Equality Act and updated safeguarding guidelines to be proactive rather than just reactive.

Information is taken from KCSIE and other documents to ensure guidance is followed.
