Safeguarding: **PREVENT**

In the UK, Prevent is a statutory government safeguarding programme designed to protect vulnerable people from being drawn into terrorism or radicalisation.

Misogyny is the hatred, contempt, or deeply rooted prejudice against women and girls. In schools, it frequently manifests as casual sexism, harmful gender stereotyping, sexual harassment, and the use of derogatory language. It is heavily fuelled by social media and online influencers.

How Misogyny Manifests in Schools

Misogyny and casual sexism in educational settings appear in several distinct ways:

- * Sexist Language and "Banter": Casual use of slurs or derogatory terms directed at female students or staff.
- * Gender Stereotyping: The reinforcement of outdated views, such as believing girls are naturally worse at certain subjects (e.g. Sports) or should fulfil certain behavioural roles.

- * Sexual Harassment: Unwanted physical contact, sexualized comments, or intimidation.
- * Online Influence and "Manosphere" Culture: The proliferation of misogynistic attitudes spread by online influencers (e.g., Andrew Tate), leading to boys parroting the belief that women are inferior or that feminism is detrimental to men.
- * Digital Misogyny: The sharing of intimate images without consent, sextortion, or the creation of deepfakes.

How Schools are Addressing It

In response to the rise of misogynistic attitudes, educational authorities (including the Department for Education in the UK) have heavily emphasised preventative measures and teacher training. There is guidance and safeguarding documents to support schools in tackling issues relating
